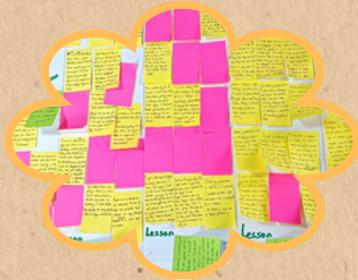


LIFE UPDATE

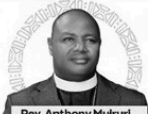
